Whereas, Moroni City fully endorses the national position on preventing the abuse of children and chooses to encourage the participation of all individuals and entities in preventing child abuse . . .

Now therefore, in order to promote the safety of our children, increase awareness of the importance of the prevention of child abuse and encourage all citizens to recognize and participate in this endeavor, the City of Moroni adopts this resolution of support and endorsement declaring the month of April 2014 as the National Child Abuse Prevention Month.

Irrigation Water

With the coming Springtime, comes the time for irrigation water. Our city employees are currently working on our system to ensure correct operation and functionality. Our tentative goal is to have irrigation water available for use between the 15th and 21st of April.

As the system becomes available, please ensure that your valves are closed, as problems can occur when the system is turned on if valves are left opened.

Irrigation Use Schedule:

All properties West of center street

Monday, Wednesday and Friday

All properties East of center street

Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

No watering on:

Sundays and
between 10:00 am to 6:00 pm on any days

Moroni City Irrigation System

On occasion we are asked about our irrigation system, and why water is restricted and why we do not simply allow use of the system at any time. Our water comes from the Sanpitch river on the south side of town. From that point, the water is pumped uphill to the north of town to ponds. From there the water goes into lines which feed individual homes and is pressurized.

Restrictions occur because of two reasons, availability of water and due to the cost of operating the system (including the operation of the pumps). If full access was provided to the system at all times, the water would be difficult to maintain and the cost for the pumps would become prohibitive and our budget would quickly dissipate.

Our system is a good system that can and does work for all citizens as we use and maintain it appropriately. If you have any questions, please contact the City Hall.
